- Complying with health and safety legislation and other specified requirements

- Developing a personal responsibility for safety through partnership and consultation with employees on matters of health and safety
- Conducting regular safety audits

We demonstrate our commitment by implementing a Safety Management System which provides a framework for setting and reviewing occupational health & safety performance, objectives and targets and meets the requirements of OHSAS 18001 and AS/NZ 4801 - Safety Management System
